INTRODUCTION

Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra established in 1956 has a well-developed multi-faculty Campus spread over 473 acres of land. Ever since laying of foundation stone by Dr Rajendra Prasad, the First President of India, the University has taken quantum leaps and has emerged as an advanced Centre of Study & Research for quality education in conformity with the international standards.

The University has centrally air-conditioned auditorium with a seating capacity of 1900 persons, Senate Hall, Conference Hall, well-equipped Sports Complex (Play fields, Gymnasium, Stadium, Swimming Pool, Tennis Courts, Volleyball, Basketball Courts, etc.), Teachers' Club, Club for Administrative staff, 26 Hostels, (12 for Boys & 14 for Girls), School, Health Centre, Business Complex, about 700 quarters for all categories of staff. Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra has a rich Jawaharlal Nehru Library with more than 3.96 lac books, 250 journals (Foreign & Indian) and 15,324 rare manuscripts, Internet Section of 200 nodes, Computer Centre, Museum, Instrumentation (USIC) workshop, NSS Centre, Students' Guest House, Faculty House, etc. In addition to CENTRE FOR DISTANCE AND ONLINE EDUCATION, Institute of Integrated & Honors' Studies and Institute of Teacher Training & Research, the University has 49 Teaching Departments/Institutes on the campus and 284 affiliated colleges situated in the Districts of Ambala, Panipat, Kaithal, Yamuna Nagar, Karnal, Kurukshetra and Panchkula.

THE CENTRE FOR DISTANCE AND ONLINE EDUCATION

Kurukshetra University initiated Distance Education Programmes in 1976 through Directorate of Correspondence Courses to provide an opportunity of higher education to the persons who could not continue their studies because of reasons beyond their control. The Directorate's endeavour has been to combine the twin objective of reaching the unreached and meeting the rising educational aspirations of the masses. With the advancement and implementation of technology in imparting education through distance mode, the Directorate was renamed as CENTRE FOR DISTANCE AND ONLINE EDUCATION (CDOE). The Centre enrolls every year about 20000 students in about 39 undergraduate and postgraduate conventional and professional Programme. The courses and their curriculum are periodically reviewed and updated to incorporate the developments in the field. The Centre is also providing two year B.Ed. programme with the approval of NCTE for the benefit of working teachers in schools and other educational institutions.

The Centre has a separate three-storey teaching-block exclusively for the distance education students. It houses well-equipped, centrally air-conditioned Computer Labs and Library, lecture halls, common-rooms, teacher-rooms, etc. The Centre for Distance and Online Education has its own website *www.ddekuk.ac.in* for Online admission and other enquiries. The study material of various courses offered by the Centre for Distance and Online Education is being made available Online in the form of books.

The Centre for Distance and Online Education has received numerous awards for excellence as well CDOE has received several accolades, including the making India Employable Award in 2023, the CSR Top University of India award in 2024, 2023, the CSR Top Institute of India Award in 2019 and 2018.

If the number of students happens to be less than 10 in any session, the programme will be suspended and students will have the option to take full fee refund or change the programme.

- 6. Admission in next year: All the students from Jan,2023 onwards will be treated as promoted cases. They shall deposit their dues and continuing students of next years than waiting for result.
- 7. Mostly from regular programmes is allowed to ODL/Online Programmes in all years the vice-versa is also allowed subject to the rules of respective Universities.

Date of admission will be considered when the fee is actually credited into the CDOE account. Students have to ensure that fees are deposited on the right portal.

Note:-

- 1. This includes Examination /Registration /Establishment /Eligibility /Continuation /Membership fee of Population Club Rs.6/- Alumni Fee Rs.100/- etc. but exclusive of late admission or late examination fees, etc.
- 2. Fees mentioned above are charged per year and can be paid in one time/two installments.
- 3. The Students may pay Rs. 1000/- as Alumni Life Time Membership Fee, if interested.
- 4. NO SEPARATE INTIMATION WILL BE SENT FOR PAYMENT OF 2ND INSTALLMENT OR ANY OTHER BALANCE OF FEE.
- 5. Any student related information viz PCP Schedule, Fee deposit, Late Fee, Exam Schedule, Admit Card, etc. will be available on the student's Dashboard and no separate information will be sent to him/her in any form.
- 6. The students of programmes having 2-years and 3-years duration enrolled with this Center for the session Jan/July 2022 and have appeared in the examinations but could not clear 50% papers of Part-I and Part-II examinations may also be provisionally allowed to join Part-II and Part-III of the concerned programmes in Jan/July 2025 session by paying an additional fee of Rs. 500/- per deficient paper payable to the University at the time of admission subject to their clearing the remaining papers of Part-I and Part-II examinations in the permissible number of chances.
- 7. Additional fees such as late admission fee, late examination fee, etc., wherever applicable are required to be paid along with the 1st installment.
- 8. FEE SHALL BE CHARGED SEPARATELY FOR EACH YEAR OF THE PROGRAMME. From the session January, 2025 the students admitted in the first year, will be promoted to next higher class and no fresh admission will be needed.
- **9.** The Blind students of Haryana residence may, on an application be granted Full Tuition Fee Concession. IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

All admissions to ODL programmes CDOE are online through IUMS portal. All application, documents, fees are submitted in online mode only. Students should maintain a unique email id and mobile number for registration. After admissions, students will get a dashboard where all the communication will be made. No separate intimation will be sent to the students.

- 1. The candidates are advised to go through the Prospectus carefully before filling up the Online Admission Form & follow other instructions issued from time to time and to visit CDOE website www.ddekuk.ac.in regularly. The candidates should also remain vigilant and get in touch with the Centre at the appropriate time in case of non-receipt of CDOE Ref. No., study material, admit card/roll number, examination date sheet, result/DMC etc. All these will be available in the dash board of student and it is responsibility of student to check it from time to time.
 - (a) For any correspondence with CDOE, candidates are advised to mention registered email id, CDOE Ref. No., Name, Father's Name, Session, Class, Subject (in case of M.A./M.Sc.) and complete address, failing which the Centre will not be responsible for non-response to such communications and consequences thereof.
 - (b) It is mandatory for the candidates to submit all fees and documents as stipulated by CDOE. The candidature of an applicant is liable to be cancelled in case of non-payment of any type of dues/fee or part thereof and/or for non-submission of any document. It can, however, be restored during the session on payment of balance dues with late fee and submission of required documents along with the revival fee, as the case may be. If the outstanding dues are not remitted and the required documents are not submitted before the termination of the theory examinations and roll number is not issued to the candidate for the annual examination, his/her candidature shall not be revived in any case thereafter. Such a candidate can, however, seek admission afresh in the subsequent session to become eligible to appear in the university examination after paying all the dues afresh, however, no adjustment/refund of fee paid in previous session will be allowed.
 - (c) The date of receipt of fee or any other document will be considered the date on which the same is received in the account of CDOE. After deposit of fees online, the student has to verify the same through his/her login id so that the same is reflected in their accounts. The Centre will not be responsible for non-receipt or late delivery of any document or dues to be deposited by a student.
 - (d) The Centre has not authorized any Agency/Institution or appointed any Agent to deal with any matter relating to admissions, examinations or other related matters. The candidates seeking admission to distance education programmes of this University are advised to contact this CDOE directly.
- 2. Recognition:
 - (a) The examinations conducted by various recognized Indian Universities/Deemed Universities/State Education Boards are recognized (with the stipulation of No. of subject (s) or any other condition in specific cases as given in the Section-V of ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS of the Prospectus) for the purpose of admission to various programmes in the Center for Distance & Online Education unless otherwise decided by the University to exclude any specific programme. The above does not apply for admission to the regular programmes in the University Teaching Departments/Colleges for which the admission will be done separately by the University.
 - (b) The examinations of foreign Universities/Boards which stand recognized by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi are recognized for the purpose of admission to various Online programmes in the Centre for Distance and Online Education.



- 3. Confirmation of Admission, allotment of CDOE Ref. No., issue of identity card, dispatch of study material, attendance of Personal Contact Programme, etc., will be **provisional** subject to confirmation of eligibility subsequently.
- 4. Admissions-Fee deposit: The Centre for Distance and Online Education offers online admission facility through its own website www.ddekuk.ac.in and www.iums.kuk.ac.in. Online submission of application form and fees can be done with a processing fee of Rs. 800/- for Gen and Rs.200/- for SC/BC/EBPG/BLIND/PWD (more than 70 % disability) Candidates of Haryana only. If the fee receipt is not downloaded from the student login, students are advised to contact the CDOE immediately.

After deposit of fees online, the student has to verify the same through his/her login so that the same is reflected in their account. If due to any technical error fee is deposited more than one time the extra fee is to be refunded as per rules.

- 5. Filling of online form-Online Admission Form will require upload of following documents. Students shall keep these ready in soft copy :-
 - (a) A self attested photocopy of the certificate of the qualifying examination passed by the candidates. The candidates, who have passed the qualifying examinations in more than one Part, shall be require to attach self-attested copies of Certificates/DMC/Degree of all the Parts. However, the candidates shall have to submit the original certificates as and when required for verification failing which their candidature may be treated as cancelled without any notice.
 - (b) A self attested photo-copy of the Matriculation or equivalent certificate in support of date of birth (Not required, if already registered with this University) along with a copy of the certificate of last examination passed.
 - (c) Self Declaration Certificate (in the case of candidates coming from Universities or Boards other than Kurukshetra University or Board of School Education, Haryana) on the proforma given to the effect as to whether or not they are appearing in any other examination simultaneously from any other University/ Board during the session January/July2025.However, Original Migration Certificate is to be submitted by those students who have already migrated from this University to another University but again took admission in this University within 40 days of their admission otherwise late fee as applicable will be charged from these students.

If the Student doing dual degree one from this University & another from Second University then the student should upload a certificate from other university as proof for the same.

- (d) A Character Certificate from the Head of the institution last attended or from a Gazetted Officer/ Sarpanch as per proforma given
- (e) Income Certificate of Parental Income from all sources, in case of BC(A) & BC B) Category candidates, applicable.
- (f) Certificate in respect of Differently Abled (DA) Candidates, if applicable
- (g) Certificate required to be furnished by the children and grand-children of Freedom Fighters (DFF), if applicable.
- (h) Certificate from Ex-Servicemen and their wards for Deceased or Disabled or Discharged Military/Paramilitary Personnel, Ex-Servicemen or Ex-Personnel of Para-Military Forces, if applicable.
- (i) Certificate from Ex-Employees and their wards for the Ex-employees of Indian Defence Service/Paramilitary Forces, if applicable.
- (j) Scanned colored photograph
- (k) Wherever applicable, self attested copy of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Economical Weaker Sections/Blind Certificate, duly signed by the 1stClass Magistrate/SDM/CMO, failing which no benefit of SC/ST Scholarship/tuition fee concession/ relaxation will be given.



- (I) Employment Certificate by employees of Kurukshetra University for claiming tuition fee concession.
- (m)SC/BC/Blind candidates of Haryana/PWD (more than 70 percent) are required to submit the SC/BC/Blind Certificate OR an additional amount of **Rs.600/-** on account of the difference of the cost of the Processing fee failing which it would be treated as non-payment of fee.
- (n) All legal disputes are subject to Kurukshetra Courts or Courts having jurisdiction in Kurukshetra.
- (o) In case of any ambiguity in the rules, interpretation of the same by the University shall be final.

Note:-

- 1. If the Center, so desires, the original certificate (s) from the candidate can be demanded for any purpose whatsoever and after doing the needful, the same will be returned
- 2. The candidates, who are appearing in Compartment/Re-appear Papers of any lower class from this University or any other University/Board simultaneously, and their result is withheld are required to submit the DMC of the result of the lower examination immediately to enable the office to get the result declared in time. While doing so, the candidate should mention registered email id, CDOE Ref. No., Examination Roll No. etc. of the programme which he/she is pursuing.
- 3. DMC of the candidates will be sent by Registered post after the declaration of the result. In case the result of any candidate is declared late (RL), 'Provisional' or 'Cancelled' etc. for any reasons, the candidates are advised to approach the Center/University immediately with the relevant documents i.e. CDOE Ref. No./Exam. Roll No. etc. to enable the Centre to take further necessary action accordingly.
- 4. Students are advised to regularly check CDOE KUK website and their dashboard on IUMS for updating.

REJECTION OF ADMISSION FORM

The Admission may be rejected due to non-fulfillment of any one or more of the following conditions, if:

- 1. The qualifying examination is not recognized by the Kurukshetra University.
- 2. Teaching experience certificate not as per specifications prescribed by the Centre (For B.Ed. Part-I only).
- 3. The admission/eligibility is not as per the respective Ordinances.
- 4. Self Attested copies of certificate/ DMC of qualifying exam are not uploaded with admission form.
- 5. Original certificate of qualifying examination is not produced in the Centre on demand.
- 6. Fee of 1^{st} Installment is not remitted in full.
- 7. Affidavit duly attested by Magistrate 1st Class as per specimen given in the Annexure-XI is not submitted. Admission Form is incomplete.



- Note:- (i) In case the admission form of any candidate is rejected due to non-submission of requisite documents, the candidature can be revived on submission of the same with balance payment together with the revival fee of Rs. 1000/- before the generation of hall tickets/roll nos.
 - (ii) If a candidate is admitted on the basis of information submitted by him/her which is found to be incorrect or false at a later stage and found to have supplied false information/certificates/documents etc. or concealed some information in his/her Admission form, his/her admission will be cancelled and fee and other dues paid by him/her shall be forfeited besides disqualification from the University. The Centre may also refer to the police for investigation and registration of an FIR in the case as deemed fit against the candidate and his/her guardian.
 - (iii) Students of this Center are not eligible for allotment of accommodation in the University Hostels. However, on request only limited number of girl/boys students can be allowed to stay as guests subject to availability in the Girls/Boys Hostels by the Chief Warden Girls/Boys, for attending the PCP and/or for appearing in the University examinations on payment of usual charges.

INSTRUCTIONS AGAINST RAGGING:

We would expect our students to make best use of this opportunity and grow as able and responsible citizens. Students will be required to work hard with their energies focused towards achieving their goal.

We take pride in informing all those desirous of seeking admission, that over all these years, our University has the best traditions of maintaining a healthy and congenial academic environment. We are also glad to convey that with the determined and sincere efforts of our senior students and faculty, our campus has been free from the menace of Ragging.

Chairpersons/Directors of all the University teaching departments/Institutes to ensure that every student and their parents be asked to submit an undertaking every academic year to the effect that the concerned students will not take part in any activity leading to ragging of junior students.

What Constitutes Ragging? Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- a) any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- b) indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c) asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary programme do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d) any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e) exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;



- f) any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g) any act of physical abuse including all variants of it : sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h) any act or abuse by spoken words, e-mails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student; any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.
- j) All the senior students are advised to guide and treat junior students affectionately.
- k) Junior students may contact their Chairpersons or other University functionaries like Proctor, Dean Students' Welfare, Chief Warden, Wardens or Chief Security Officer for help and guidance.-
- I) Students of CDOE shall submit Anti-Ragging forms during PCP.

Note: Use of Alcohol is prohibited on the University Campus.

III TUITION FEE CONCESSION/FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

1. To motivate the girls for education, a scheme named "Shikshit Beti" is applicable in CDOE for those girls who have

obtained more than 70% marks at 10+2 level in which 25% concession in tuition fee is provided for taking admission to B.A-I only in the Center. The same concession to these students will be continued for B.A-II & III provided they obtained 70% marks in BA-I & BA-II respectively.

- 2. The **Blind students of Haryana residence may be granted Full Tuition Fee Concession**. In addition, SC and BC students of Haryana residence are granted financial aid by the State Government in order to meet expenditure on tuition fee etc. in accordance with the rules framed by the Haryana Government from time to time.
- 3. Benefits of Fee for SC Candidates of Haryana (as decided by the Academic Branch) There is a Post Matric Scholarship Scheme of GOI for welfare of candidate belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category. As per letter No.3/44-2012 Sch.(2) dated 18.06.2013 of the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula. Such students whose parents/guardian income is upto Rs. 2.50 Lac per annum are eligible for benefits under the said scheme. The benefits include enrollment/registration, tuition, games, Union, Library, Magazine, Medical Examination and such other fees compulsorily payable by the student to the institution or University/Board. Refundable deposit like caution money, security deposit are, however, excluded. For students admitted under this scheme the application form has to be submitted by the students to the Director of the Institute.
- Note: An income declaration shall be furnished by the self-employed parents/guardian. Employed parents are required to obtain income certificates from their employer and for any additional income from other sources; they would furnish declaration by way of an affidavit on non-judicial stamp paper.
- (i) No fee* will be charged by the University from the students belonging to SC category, whose parent's Income is upto 2.50 Lac p.a. They shall be admitted during the academic session January/July 2025 as per instructions of the Director, Higher Education, Haryana and the Director General, Technical Education



Department, Panchkula, Haryana. However, as per instructions dated 01.09.2018 of the Director, welfare of SC/BC Classes Department Haryana., Chandigarh, the students belonging to the Scheduled Caste Category who after verification of record by the office are found eligible for the PMS Scholarship, shall have to submit an undertaking in the Fee Section of the Centre for Distance and Online Education that they will deposit their fee immediately to the Centre as soon as they receive the Scholarship in their bank account.

- (ii) Students belonging to the SC Category who are eligible for Post Matric Scholarship Scheme should get their saving Bank Account linked with Aadhaar Card to get transferred the funds in their respective Bank Accounts.
- (iii) Students who are eligible for Scheduled Caste Scholarship(s) may apply online on the dates which will be announced/published in the newspaper/highereduhry.com portal by the State Govt./Funding Agencies.
- (iv) No intimation in this regard will be sent by the Centre separately.
- (v) The eligible applicants are required to submit hard copy of Post Matric Scholarship form in this Centre immediately.

NOTE: *THOSE CANDIDATES WHO HAVE NOT APPLIED FOR POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP ON THE WEB PORTAL OF GOVT. OF HARYANA BY DUE DATE, THEY WILL HAVE TO PAY FULL FEE BEFORE THE ISSUE OF EXAMINATION ROLL NO./hall ticket.

- 4. Free Education for Dependent Children of Leprosy Affected Persons (LAPs): No fee/dues will be charged from the dependent children of Leprosy Affected Persons and education in the Centre for Distance and Online Education will be free for them.
- 5. Full Tuition Fee Concession out of the fee payable to the University is admissible to the University Employees and their sons/daughters, younger sisters/brothers (wholly dependent) and non-working wife as per Ordinance XXII printed at page 299 in K.U. Calendar Vol.-I, 2009. Rest of the dues are payable in two installments.
- **6.** Full Tuition Fee Concession in traditional programmes and 50% fee concession in professional programmes to the maximum two wards of retired University employees up to the age limit of 25 years with the condition that wards should not be in service and if there is any gap in their studies, employees should furnish affidavit duly attested by Notary Public that his/her son/daughter was not in service during the gap period.

IV. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Financial assistance to a limited extent can be allowed to a very small number of students on meritcum-means basis after having deposited the admission form and 1stinstallment of fee **on submission of an Income Certificate from 1stClass Magistrate** to validate the request. The annual income limit of the family by all sources should be upto Rs.1,50,000/- OR less for getting the Financial Assistance. However, the submission of application for financial assistance will not give any right to the candidate not to deposit or late deposit the 2^{md} installment of fee/other dues or to allow exemption from payment of late fee. Application for financial assistance along with the required Income Certificate should reach the office by 30th June2025 for January, 2025 session. Application received after this date would be rejected. The Financial Assistance will be given from the RK Fund.

V. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International Students are not allowed in any ODL programme and will be allowed only in Online programmes as per DEB letter F. No. 12-1/2024 (DEB-I) dated 26.04.2024.



FORMATIVE (INTERNAL) ASSESSMENT

(Guidelines and Instructions)

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

All programmes of the Center have formative assessment of 30 % from the session July 2024 onwards. For old students of promotional classes this assessment is 20 %. for all programmes except B.Ed.

Guidelines for FORMATIVE (Internal Assessment):

- 1. The Centre would conduct written test(s) through Offline mode during Personal Contact Programmes. The written test(s) would be based on the syllabus of the concerned course(s).
- 2. In case, a candidate has not appeared in Internal Assessment test or he/she took admission after Personal Contact Programmes, then he/she will be awarded internal assessment proportionately on the basis of marks obtained by him/her in final examination. The internal assessment once awarded will not be revised afterwards.
- 3. The results of the students of all the programmes having Internal Assessment would be computed after aggregating the marks obtained by the candidates in theory papers and the Internal Assessment.
- 4. The marks of Internal Assessment obtained by the students will be displayed on the CDOE Website <u>www.ddekuk.ac.in</u>and students may apply for removal of discrepancy, if any, in their Internal Assessment and can also get their answer sheets re-checked Provision on IUMS on remittance of Rs.200/- within 7days from the date of uploading the Internal Assessment Marks Provision on IUMS portal on the CDOE Website.

APPLICABILITY OF SYLLABI AND SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

- 1. Unless otherwise decided in any specific case, the syllabi, scheme of examination and duration of the programmes and mode of examination will be the same as prescribed for regular students of the University Teaching Departments and the Colleges affiliated to the Kurukshetra University.
- 2. A candidate who fails in an examination or having been eligible fails to appear in the examination, shall, unless approved otherwise by the Academic Council, will appear in the examination according to the syllabus prescribed by the University for regular students for that examination.
- 3. Copy of syllabi in force for the distance education programmes will be appended on the first page of study material for reference to the students and will also be available at CDOE website<u>www.ddekuk.ac.in</u>
- 4. Notwithstanding the integrated nature of the programmes which are spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinance in force at the time that a student joins the programme shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic session and nothing in the rule shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the rules and the amended rules, if any, shall apply to all students whether old or new.
- 5. Where the number of chances or total period for passing the Programme is limited, the candidates shall have to pass the examination including re-appear papers, if any, within the admissible chances during the period as prescribed in the respective Ordinance of the Programme.
- 6. The candidates are not allowed to offer any other option except the one mentioned in the Prospectus.
- 7. Candidates should clearly fill the options in their Online Admission Form.

Pass in B.A.(General) Part-I/Part-II examination, under 10+2+3 scheme of Kurukshetra University or of another University, the B.A. (General) Part-I/Part-II examination under open stream of this University or any other University which is recognized as equivalent to B.A.(General) examination of this University, or **LL.B.** Part - I/II(5 years) examination of the Kurukshetra University, provided that the subjects offered by the candidate in B.A. (General) Part-I & II are the same as are available in B.A.- I & II at Kurukshetra University and the candidate is otherwise eligible.

RULES REGARDING ADMISSION FOR COMPARTMENT CANDIDATES

- (a) The candidates who have been placed under compartment are allowed to re-appear in one subject only in the Senior Secondary examination (10+2 Standard) of the Board of School Education, Haryana or an equivalent examination of another University/ Board may be admitted provisionally for B.A.(General)/ B.Com./B.C.A. Part-I/D.Lib. SC./CCA. Such candidates shall be required to clear the compartment/re-appear subject in two chances i.e. in the supplementary examinations to be held in Sept./Oct., 2025and in March, 2026 from the concerned University/Board. If such a candidate fails to produce the proof of having cleared/passed/qualified the compartment/re-appear subject at the supplementary examination and at the Annual Examinations, his/her provisional admission to the said programme shall be treated as cancelled abinitio, with no claim for refund/adjustment of fees, without any further notice.
- (b) The candidates who have passed 10+2 examination after appearing in full subjects in the supplementary examination, 2025 shall also be eligible for admission to B.A.(General)/ B.Com./B.C.A.Part-I/D.Lib.Sc./CCA programme but ordinarily up to such date as may be prescribed in the Prospectus provided that the candidate is in a position to fulfill the requirement of attendance in the PCP of the programme at that stage. The candidates who have appeared in 10+2 examination in full subjects in the supplementary examination, 2024 but are unable to clear the examination are not eligible for admission.
- (c) Candidates who got compartment/re-appear in 10+2 examination in not more than one subject after appearing in full subjects in the supplementary examination 2024 may be allowed provisional admission to B.A.(General)/B.Com./B.C.A.Part-I/D.Lib.Sc./CCA programme provided that the candidate is in a position to fulfill the requirement of attendance in the PCP of the programme at that stage at their own risk and responsibility, subject to their passing the 10+2 examination up to March, 2025examination and submission of result within one month from the date of declaration of their result failing which their candidature/result to the said programme shall stand cancelled ab-initio with no claim for refund/adjustment of fees.
- (d) A candidate who has not passed the subject of English in qualifying examination may be allowed provisionally to join the B.A.(General)/B.Com./B.C.A. Part-I/D.Lib. Sc./CCA Class, subject to qualifying the subject of English at the supplementary examination of the same year or annual examination of the following year. Provided that result of such candidates of the respective examinations shall be declared only after they have qualified in the required subject. If they do not clear the subject of English even in the next annual examination in March, 2025, their provisional admission/result to the said programme shall be cancelled ab-initio with no claim for refund/adjustment of fees.
- (e) A candidate who is placed under compartment in one subject only in the qualifying examination, i.e. B.A. Part-I, Il of Kurukshetra University may be allowed provisionally to move to the next higher class subject to clearing the compartment subject in two consecutive chances up to the next annual examination to be held in May/June,2026 (For old students only).

The objective of the field work is to provide first-hand knowledge to students on various local environmental aspects on the basis of their:

- Visit to local area to document environmental assets river/forest/grassland/hill/mountain.
- Visit to a local polluted site -Urban/Rural/Industrial/Agricultural
- Study of common plants, insects, birds.
- Study of simple ecosystems-pond, river, hill slopes, etc.

Minimum pass marks is 35% both in Theory as well as Field Work (Practical) independently. However, marks obtained by them in this qualifying paper will not be counted for determining the percentage of marks/division obtained by them for the award of the "Degree". The marks obtained by the candidates in this subject will be reflected in the Detailed Marks Certificate.

The candidates who will not be able to pass in the subject of Environmental Studies (Theory and/or Field Work (Practical) in 1st year will have to qualify the same by appearing in the examination in 2nd year or 3rd year or thereafter by submitting a separate examination form and examination fee of Rs. 50/- as an ex-student as in the case of Reappear/Compartment candidates. There will, however, be no supplementary examination the subject of Environmental Studies.

The students of the Centre for Distance and Online Education who have to appear in the paper of Environmental Studies are required to submit their Project Report of around 20 pages to the Principal of the concerned College on the scheduled date examination of the said paper. The students will also pay a fee of Rs.50/- by each to the Principal of the concerned College on account of conduct of their examination in the subject of Environmental Studies.

The M.A. Sociology has been divided into four Semester spread over two years. Every Student has to pass in 84 credits(48 Compulsory + 32 Optional Credits and 4 Credits 2 in Semester II and 2 in Semester III from Optional Elective Paper from other Department-) out of 148 Credits as necessary to earn the degree under the new scheme. In 1st and 2ndsemesters, <u>12 Compulsory Credits from</u> Compulsory Papers and 8 Optional Credits from Optional Papers shall be offered to the students, whereas in 3rd& 4thsemester <u>8 Compulsory Credits from Compulsory Papers and 12 Optional Credits</u> from Optional Papers_shall be offered to the students. 



The eligibility conditions for admission to B.Ed.(2-year) Programme through Distance Mode will be as under:-

- (j) Bachelor's /Master's degree from a recognized University with atleast 50% marks in aggregate(47.5% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Physically Handicapped candidates) OR 55% in case of BE/B.Tech(52.25% in case of SC/ ST/Blind/Physically Handicapped candidates) as per directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- (ii) Trained in-service teachers in elementary education.
- (iii) Candidates who have completed a NCTE recognized teacher education programme through face-toface mode.
- (iv) Only in service teachers working in any Recognized Government/Aided/Private School/Educational Institution are eligible.

NOTE:-

- (a) The Teaching Experience Certificate will be accepted only on the prescribed proforma given at Annexure-XIII in the Prospectus. In case a candidate has served in more than one Institution(with/without break), he/she should use the photocopy of this proforma for submitting the teaching experience certificates for each institution of service.
- (b) The candidates seeking admission in B.Ed. 1st Year should ensure to submit proof of Teaching Experience in a school/other educational institutions duly certified by Headmaster/Principal on the prescribed format as per Annexure-XII.

The concerned Chairperson/Director of the Department/Institute shall maintain a roster register for horizontal reservation of Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighter & their dependents and carry forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the year. As and when the total comes to one, a seat will be provided to the concerned category.			

(C) Guidelines for Reservation :

- 1. The Reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of the Haryana Govt. and is subject to any change/amendment by the State Govt. from time to time.
- 2. If the reserved seat(s) of BC Block 'A' remain vacant these will be filled up from BC Block 'B' and vice versa.
- 3. The seats remaining vacant under various reserved categories other than SC category will be converted into General Category only if up to the date of display of final list or day of final counseling (whichever applicable), no eligible candidate belonging to the respective reserved categories is available for admission.
- 4. If a candidate of Haryana General, SC, BC and EWSs also apply for Differently Abled/ESM/DFF category will be considered first for Haryana General, SC ,BC and EWSs category.
- 5. Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste will submit the certificate as per Annexure-IV, Backward Class (BI5.ock 'A' & 'B') will submit the certificate on the prescribed Proforma as per Annexure-V, and Income Certificate from the Competent Authority at the time of Counseling. Vide Notification No.1282-SW(I) dated 28.08.2018 the Government Notification No.808-SW(I) dated 17.08.2016 has been examined in consultation with the Advocate General Haryana. The Advocate



General relying upon the judgment of the Hon'ble Puniab and Harvana High Court has opined that the criteria for computing annual income as prescribed under the above notification as gross annual income shall include income from all sources. All previous notifications and instructions provided for a different mode of computing annual income stands over-ridden. Income certificate mentioning gross annual income issued after 17.08.2016 shall only be considered for availing any benefit under BC(A) and BC(B) category. Instructions for gross annual income of BC (A) and BC (B) category issued vide Haryana Government, Welfare of Schedule Castes and Backward Classes Department Notification No. 1282-SW(1) dated 28.08.2018 be followed and Haryana Government Notification No. 808-SW(1) dated 17.08.2016 be set aside as the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh vide its judgment dated 07.08.2018 rendered in CWP 15731 of 2018, titled as Nisha vs. State of Haryana and ors. while deciding bunch of CWPs including CWP No. 18234, Anupama & Anuradha Vs. State of Haryana and Others (relating to admission under BC category in LL.B. 3-Yr. programme of the KUK session 2018-19) while allowing the said CWPs the Hon'ble High Court has set aside the Harvana Govt. Notification dated 17.08.2016 and has further directed that the counseling shall be held afresh on the basis of the earlier existing criteria limiting the preference to those BCs with an income upto Rs.6 lakhs with no further sub-classification.

- 6. Sons and Daughters of Parents whose annual income from all sources does not exceed Rs. 8 Lakh can apply for All India Category seats (i.e. 15% of sanctioned intake) under Central Govt. policy would be in addition to the existing reservation upon production of an Income & Asset Certificate issued by a competent authority (i.e. DM/DC/ADC/SDM or Tehsildar.
- 7. Only the candidates having permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the programme) will be considered for admission as Differently Abled. Disability certificate must be issued by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned District. However, the certificate shall be subject to verification by a Medical Board of the University constituted for the purpose and the decision of the Board shall be final. Differently abled candidates belonging to Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per **Annexure-VII**.
- 8. Children and Grand-Children of Freedom Fighters of Haryana are required to submit a certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner of the concerned District as per **Annexure-VIII**.
- 9. Certificate from Ex-Servicemen and their wards for Deceased or Disabled or Discharged Military/ Para-Military Personnel, Ex-Servicemen or Ex-Personnel of Para-Military Forces as per **Annexure-X**.
- 10. Certificate from Ex-Employees and their wards for the Ex-employees of Indian Defence Services/Para-Military Forces as per Annexure-XI.
- 11. For horizontal reservation, ESM/DFF candidates of General, SC and BC category will also have to furnish ESM/DFF certificate.
- 12. As per instructions of the Government of Haryana, General Administration Department, General Services-III Branch, Chandigarh containing in letter No. 23/10/2013-1GSIII dated 10.08.2017 for giving following priorities for reservations or preferences to the wards of Armed Forces personnel for admission in medical/professional/professional programmes running in the University Teaching Departments/ Institutes/ Affiliated/Maintained Colleges/ Institutes:
 - (a) Priority-I : Widows/Wards of Defence personnel killed in action.
 - (b) Priority-II : Wards of disabled in action and boarded out from service.
 - (c) Priority-III : Widows /Wards of Defence personnel who died while in service with death attributable to service.
 - (d) Priority-IV : Wards of disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service.
 - (e) Priority-V : Wards of Ex-servicemen who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards:
 - (i) Param Vir Chakra
 - ii) Ashok Chakra
 - iii) Sarvottam Yudh Seva Medal
 - iv) Maha Vir Chakra
 - v) Kirti Chakra



- vi) Uttam Yudh Seva Medal
 vii) Vir Chakra
 viii) Shaurya Chakra
 ix) Yudh Seva Medal
 x) Sena, Nau Sena, Vayu Sena Medal
 xi) Mention in-Despatches
- (f) Priority-VI : Wards of Ex-servicemen.

The Admission Committee vide its Res.No. 6 dated 14.05.2018 has resolved the above instructions of the State Govt. be implemented in all the programmes being run in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes & affiliated/ maintained Colleges.

- 13. In pursuance of the decision of Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh dated 11/4/2013 in the LPA 98/2013 (O&M) CWP No.20359 of 2012, Shri. Ishwar Singh Vs KUK & Others, preference shall be given to ESM first before giving admission to wards against ESM reserved seats.
- 14. Under differently abled category, atleast one candidate will be admitted even if the share is less than 0.5 seat.
- 15. All the eligible candidates, whether from Haryana or from reserved categories can also compete for seats allocated under All India Category.
- 16. All the eligible candidates of reserved categories shall be considered first for Haryana General Category seats.
- 17. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a university in the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana residents and will not be required to submit certificates of bonafide residents of Haryana.
- Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Government of Haryana, Notification No. 23/12/2019-1 GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 as under:-
 - (a) Income & Assets Certificate issuing Authority:
 - (i) The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Competent Authority for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be Tehsildar of the area where the applicant normally resides.
 - (ii) As per instructions given in Govt. of Haryana General Administration Dept. (G-III Branch) Notification No. 23/12/2019-1GS-III dated 13.03.2019, Verifying Authorities for issue of EWS Certificate shall be same as prescribed for issue of resident/income certificates as specified in instruction No.23/28/2003 3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004.
 - (iii) The prescribed format for Economically Weaker Section(EWS) Income and Asset Certificate shall be provided at <u>Annexure-IX.</u>

(b) Criteria of Income & Assets:

- (i) Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 6.00 lakh (Rupees six lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation, Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.
- (ii) Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-
 - (aa) 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
 - (ab) Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - (ac) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;



- (ad) Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities;
 (ae) Total immovable assets owned are valued at Rs. One Crore or more.
- (iii) The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- (iv) The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who applies for benefit of reservation, his/her parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18 years.
- **Note:-** For any other clarification, Government of Haryana, Notification No. 23/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 will be referred

IMPORTANT NOTE

- (i) Candidates who are placed under compartment in the qualifying examination (Bachelor's degree or equivalent examination) shall not be allowed admission to Previous/Part-I of any Master's degree or Advanced Graduate Diploma programme even provisionally. However, such candidates can seek admission to programmes after passing the compartment subject in the supplementary examination but ordinarily up to such date as may be prescribed in the Prospectus with usual late fee provided that the PCP for the said programme has not been over. A) CAUTION:

1. The Dissertation/Project Report/Field Work/Assignments/Practical Assignments/ Translation Work/ Training Report, etc. must be the ORIGINAL WORK of the candidate. Every candidate is required to make his/her own study and findings. The presentation of material common with any report submitted in the same session OR in the past in any Department/College/Institution will be considered as a case of copying and would lead to cancellation of Dissertation/Project Report/Field Work/ Practical Assignment/ Assignments/ Translation Work/Training Reports etc. apart from registration of UNFAIR MEANS CASE (UMC) against the candidate. Two candidates cannot submit a common Dissertation/Project Report/ Practical Assignments/ Translation Work/Training Report on the same topic.



2. Medium of Examination of the programme will be the medium of writing Dissertation/ Project Report/ Field Work/ Assignment/ Practical Assignment/ Translation Work/ Training Report, etc.

B) TENTATIVE POINTS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE CANDIDATES FOR WORKING ON DISSERTATION/PROJECT REPORT, ETC.:

- 1. The selection of topic for Dissertation/Project Report is very important as the quality of work and its timely completion depends upon it. For selecting appropriate topic, candidates are advised to go through some of the Dissertation/Project Reports of the candidates of earlier session available in the Library of the Centre for Distance and Online Education, Kurukshetra University OR other Universities. This will give them an idea about the nature of the topic, research work involved, contents, methodology etc. Active supervision by an experienced teacher is the most important aspect of any project work. The candidates should finalize the topics in consultation with the Supervisor and seek approval of the Programme Coordinator well in time.
- 2. There is no standard size of Dissertation/Project Report as it can vary with the subject of project. However, it can be around 80 to 100 typed pages having 1.5 line spaces with 12 size-points on A4 size in Aria Font for English and Kruti Dev font for Hindi. The work should be brief and precise. The Dissertation/Project Report should be neatly typed and properly bound.
- 3. **Footnotes**, References should be given on each page OR at the end of each Chapter to acknowledge the works quoted/referred to in the Dissertation/Project Report.
- 4. THE DISSERTATION/PROJECT REPORTS SHOULD CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING:
 - (a) Cover page giving title of Dissertation/Project Report, particulars of the candidate, Name and address along with designation of the Supervisor, Programme, CDOE Ref. No./Examination Roll No. and Session etc.
 - (b) Copy of Proforma duly approved by the Programme-Coordinator for the approval of Topic and Name of Supervisor.
 - (c) Certificate (in Original) from the Supervisor stating that the candidate has done independent and original work of required standard under his/her supervision.
 - (d) Certificate of declaration by the candidate that the Dissertation is his/her own ORIGINAL WORK and is the result of his/her own efforts.
 - (aa) Preface/Acknowledgment.
 - (ab) Contents.
 - (ac) List of Tables, Graphs, etc.
- 5. TENTATIVE CHAPTER SCHEME OF THE DISSERTATION/PROJECT REPORT:
 - (a) Introduction and Review of related literature pointing out gaps in the study with purpose & significance of the study.
 - (b) Objectives of the study.
 - (c) Research Methodology: techniques of data collection, Nature of data, use of quantitative techniques limitation of the study etc.
 - (d) Compilation, interpretations and Analysis of data.
 - (e) Main findings/conclusion and suggestion for policy implication.
 - (f) Bibliography/References.
 - (g) Annexure etc.



C) GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED BY THE CANDIDATES DURING THE TRAINING/INTERNSHIP PERIOD:

- 1. Fill up the required proforma for getting names of the organization approved from the programme coordinator.
- 2. The official designation and signature along with the official stamp of the supervisor and the common seal of the company/Institution should be properly affixed in the said proforma.
- 3. The training must be related to area of programme/programme.
- 4. Training supervisor should be managerial personnel in the relevant field.
- 5. The instructions given by the training Supervisor must be followed.
- 6. During the training period observe the rules and regulations of the Company/organization.
- 7. On the completion of the training period, obtain a 'CERTIFICATE OF TRAINING' on the letter head of the Company. It should be signed and properly stamped by either the training Supervisor **OR** authorized signatory of the company.

1. SUBMISSION OF MIGRATION CERTIFICATE/AFFIDAVIT

(in lieu of Migration Certificate)

All the candidates who have passed their last examination from any other University/Board (other than the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra and the Board of School Education, Haryana) are required to submit their original Migration Certificate OR Self declaration in lieu of Migration Certificate (strictly according to the Proforma given at the end of the Prospectus) to the effect that they are not appearing in any other examination from any other University/ Board during the session 2024 simultaneously except in the examination(s) mentioned in the Important Instructions No. 5 given in the beginning of the Prospectus. THIS DECLARATION MUST BE SENT ALONG WITH THE ADMISSION FORM FAILING WHICH THE ADMISSION FORM IS LIABLE TO BE REJECTED. Submission of wrong affidavit will lead to cancellation of admission with no claim for refund of fees or restoration of candidature in the subsequent session and the candidate will have to bear all other consequences in this regard.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Original Migration Certificate only is to be submitted in respect of those students who have already migrated from Kurukshetra University and later again took admission in this University within 40 days of their re-admission to this university otherwise late fee as applicable for deposit of migration certificate for restoration cases will be charged.

2. ISSUE OF MIGRATION CERTIFICATE

A student enrolled with the Centre for Distance and Online Education may be allowed to migrate to any other University or Board in mid of the session provided he/she gets his/her candidature cancelled. **NO REFUND OF FEES ALREADY PAID WILL BE ALLOWED.**

REFUND OF FEES

If a candidate withdraws from the programme/programme in which he/she was admitted in the Centre for Distance & Online Education, the fee to the candidate will be refunded as per following rules.

- (a) Refund of fees is permissible only when an applicant submits complete admission form with all required certificates and documents but is declared ineligible for not fulfilling the eligibility conditions. The fees and funds paid by such a candidate shall be refunded after a deduction of 25% of the total amount paid by him/her with the approval of the Director. Application for refund under this rule shall be entertained only if it reaches the Centre within six months of the issue of the letter by the Center declaring the candidate as ineligible or upto **31 January**, **2026** whichever is later.
- (b) Amount deposited in excess of prescribed fees, if any, will be refunded after deducting 10% of the excess amount on a request received from the students within six months from the date of deposit or by 31/01/2026 (for January, 2025 session), whichever is later with the approval of the Director.
- (c) In case of demise of a candidate pursuing distance education programme before the commencement of exams without having appeared in any paper, the fee paid by such student shall be refunded after deduction of 10% of the total amount paid by him/her with the approval of the Director (CDOE) provided the request from any of his/her parents or first relation is received within six months from the date of death or upto 31/01/2026 (for January, 2025 session), whichever is later.
- (d) In case a candidate deposits/remits fee with the Center which is not related to his/her admission in the Centre or the admission form of a candidate is not entertained being time-barred, the fee paid by such candidate will be refunded after deducting 10% of the fee paid provided the request for refund is received within six months from the date of deposit or letter from the University or by **30/05/ 2026** for July sessions, whichever is earlier.
- (e) In case the request of a candidate for change of subject/programme/option/revival of candidature is not acceded to for any reason whatsoever, the fee paid by him/her for change of subject / option / programme/ revival of candidature will be refunded after deducting 10% of the fee paid provided the request for refund is received within six months of conveying the rejection or upto 30th May 2026 for both sessions, whichever is earlier.
- Note:- The Centre would process the refund of fee as given in Note (a–f) by 31/01/2026 for January, 2025 session and 31/07/2026 for July, 2025 session. However, If due to any technical error fee is deposited more than one time the full fee is to be refunded.

THE FEES REMITTED BY THE APPLICANT SHALL NOT BE REFUNDED IF:

SECTION - IX EXAMINATIONS

A. GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT EXAMINATIONS

- The annual examination of undergraduate and post graduate programmes will tentatively commence from 1st week of November, 2025 & Dec, 2025(for January, 2025 session) respectively and the date of commencement of the annual examinations of one-year Certificate/Diploma/Advanced Graduate Diploma programmes will tentatively be in the second week November, 2025 & Dec, 2025 (for January 2025 session). These can, however, be extended under some compelling circumstances. Exact dates shall, however, be notified by the Controller of Examinations. No request for adjustment in dates of the University examination to suit the convenience of any person will be entertained.
- 2. Admit Cards/Roll No. Slips and date sheet for appearing in the University examination shall be provisional subject to fulfilling the eligibility, etc. Admit Cards/Roll Nos. and date-sheets are generally dispatched to the candidates concerned by the Centre 10-12 days before the commencement of examination concerned, if the students have fulfilled all the requirements and paid their all kinds of fees/dues and submitted the requisite documents. If any candidate does not receive his/her Admit Card/Roll No. slip in time, he/she should contact the Centre with two passport size photographs for issue of duplicate Roll No. Slip/Admit Card two days before the commencement of examination.
- 3. No correspondence regarding Non-Receipt of Roll Number will be entertained from any student after the Theory Papers Examinations are over and He/She himself/herself will be responsible for the consequences of not appearing in the Examinations. The University in such cases will not consider the requests of the students for refund/adjustment of fee paid by them or any claim for compensation or re- examination.
- 4. Evaluation for B.Ed. Programme:

Theory: For theory courses, evaluation comprises following aspects:

- (a) 30% internal assessment for theory papers on Assignments.
- (b) The term-end examination has a weightage of 70% of the total for each programme.

Practical: For Practical courses, evaluation comprises the following aspects:

- (a) 75/175 marks internal assessment for Programme-XIII Teaching Practice, Pedagogy I & II,
- (b) 50% for Programme-XII–Enhancing Professional capacities (EPC) 1, 2, 3 & 4.

5. For B.Ed. Programme - Skill in Teaching (Class-Room Teaching Practice)

Teaching practice: A learner enrolled in the B.Ed. programme shall go through a teaching practice for three months, in the schools where he/she works, under supervision of senior teacher/academic counselor. Each lesson will be a guided, supervised, assessed, lesson and feedback given. The learner shall be provided constructive feedback on his/her performance (Strengths and weakness) by the supervisors/teacher educators. Thus, the learner shall discuss with supervisors/ teacher educators the preparation of the lesson plans, delivery of lessons and feedback on the lessons delivered. Each learner shall receive personal supervision and feedback on his/her teaching practice from the teacher.



6. ANNUAL EXAMINATION for B.Ed. Programme

The examination will be held two times during the B.Ed. (2-Years) programme at the end of each session i.e. December, 2024/January, 2025 respectively.

- 7. For Compartment cases of B.A./B.Com., the **Supplementary examination** shall ordinarily be held in the month of **September/October** or on such dates as may be fixed by the University. For eligible Re-appear cases of other programmes, the Supplementary examination shall be held in the month of **November/December** or on such dates as may be fixed by the University. **The Roll number and date** sheet for the Supplementary examinations shall be sent to the candidates concerned direct by the Examination Branches. No correspondence for Re-Appear Examinations will be entertained by the Center.
- 8. The candidates who apply for Re-appear/Supplementary Examination are advised to contact to the Examination Branches/Controller of Examinations directly for all kind of information related to Re-appear/Supplementary Examinations.
- 9. The candidates who apply for Re-evaluation/Re-checking of Answer Book(s) are advised to contact directly to the Assistant/Deputy Registrar (Re-evaluation), Examination Wing-I, K.U. Kurukshetra. There is no role of the Centre and no correspondence will be entertained by the Centre in this regard.
- 10. All rules and regulations as contained in the Calendars of this University shall be applicable for matters not specifically covered in the Prospectus.

C. INSTRUCTIONS FOR RE-APPEAR/COMPARTMENT/FAILED/EX-STUDENTS

1. A student who has completed the prescribed programme of instruction in the Centre and other requirements such as, payment of full fee, submission of required documents including Migration Certificate or affidavit as per annexure, attendance at PCP where compulsory, but does not appear in the examination, or having appeared fails or is placed under compartment/Reappear, may be allowed to appear/re-appear in the examination/paper(s) as the case may be, as an ex-student, without attending a fresh programme of instruction, in the permissible chances within the maximum period prescribed in the relevant Ordinance for passing the programme. (For B.Ed. Programme: While re-appearing in the examination, the candidate shall be exempted from re-appearing in the paper(s)/ practical(s) in which he/she has obtained at least 40% marks.) The last date for submission of Examination Forms for appearing in the Supplementary Examination is 5thAugust for Under-graduate programmes and 20th September for Post-graduate programmes or as indicated on the prescribed Examination Form, which is available on the KUK Website: www.kuk.ac.in. If the result of a candidate is declared late he/she can submit his/her Examination Form within 20 days of the date of declaration of the result as mentioned on the front side of D.M.C., OR 15 days from the date of dispatch of the DMCs by the Examination Branch/CDOE, whichever is later. Re-appear/failed/compartment candidates will submit their Examination Forms directly to the concerned Examination Branch after getting the same attested to avoid misplacement of the same. The failed candidates or candidates who have got reappear in more than 50% papers can appear only at the next annual examination to be held in for both sessions, as the case may be.

The Roll Numbers/Admit Cards and date-sheet of ex-students will be sent to them directly by the Examination Branch.

- 2. A candidate appearing as an Ex-student of this Centre shall pay the examination fee as prescribed by the Kurukshetra University from time to time. The Examination Forms can be obtained from the University Press on payment of Rs. 10/- at the counter and can be obtained by Registered post from the Manager, Printing & Publications, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra by sending crossed Bank draft for Rs. 50/- drawn in favour of Registrar, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. The Examination Form can also be downloaded from the University Website: www.kuk.ac.in
- 3. All the particulars in the Examination Form must be completed in a legible handwriting. Examination Form alongwith full fee in the form of crossed Bank Draft should reach the Centre for Distance and Online Education at least one week before the date fixed by the University for Submission of Examination Forms as indicated on the Examination Form so that the same may be sent to the Examination Branch, duly attested by the Centre in time. If the Examination Form and/or fee are received late, candidate shall be required to pay usual late fee as prescribed under rules. The Ex-students are advised to submit their Examination Forms personally in the Exam. Branch, after getting the same attested from this Centre in order to avoid payment of late fee.
- 4. The Examination Forms can also be got attested from the Gazetted Officer or the Principal of a college affiliated with any recognized University in the country by showing the DMC and identity card. The Examination Fee can also be deposited in cash with Punjab National Bank in University campus.
- 5. For attestation of Examination Form from this Centre, students are required to bring with them their identity cards, issued by the Centre and the DMCs for verification.



- 6. All enquiries about payment of fee in respect of ex-students may be addressed to the Superintendent (Cash & Fee) Accounts Branch, K.U., Kurukshetra. Further inquiry, if any, regarding the result etc. of ex-students may be made from the office of the Controller of Examinations, K.U.K.(Phone: 01744-238377/238189) OR Examination Enquiry at Phone No. 01744-238169 OR at Intercom No. 2454 through KU Telephone Exchange No. 238410/238196/238629/ 238679).
- **Note:-** The Bank Draft for the Examination Fee should be drawn in favour of Registrar, Kurukshetra University payable at Kurukshetra. The candidate must mention his/her name, father's name, address, class of exam on the backside, left corner of the Bank Draft to avoid loss of the same. Attested Examination Form may be submitted directly to the concerned Examination Branch.



SECTION - X

INSTRUCTIONAL METHODOLOGY

1. STUDY MATERIAL

- (a) Each programme is divided into Lessons which are planned, developed, designed and prepared by the competent faculty members drawn from different Universities/Colleges/Institutions under the leadership of the Coordinator of various programmes who are senior teachers of Kurukshetra University. Though every effort will be made to provide the study material, however, the students may also consult books prescribed/recommended in the relevant syllabus and not to depend solely on study material to enrich and enlarge scope of learning. The study material supplied by the Centre is only to supplement the prescribed/ recommended books. The available study material will be supplied to the students in installments.
- (b) Discrepancy, if any, in the dispatch of study material should be brought to the notice of the Centre immediately. If any student receives study material for wrong subject(s)/option(s), he/ she should return the same to the Center, while pointing out the discrepancy, to enable the Center to supply the correct study material immediately.
- (c) It is not obligatory to cover the complete syllabi in study material. However, efforts will be made to cover up the deficiency in the study material, if any, due to delay in writing/updating or printing of the same, in the Personal Contact Programme to be arranged by the Centre. it will, however, not be accepted as basis for seeking postponement of the examination or refund/ adjustment of fee, etc.

2. PERSONAL CONTACT PROGRAMME

- (a) The instruction through study material is supplemented by Personal Contact Programme (s) of one week to 24 days duration depending upon the programme. This programme includes on-line/Off-line regular effective class-room teaching, practical, wherever applicable, face to face discussions, promoting thereby an interaction between the teachers and the taught. However, no PCP of a class/programme may be conducted if the enrolment in that class/programme is very small.
- (b) Interactive contact classes/Personal Contact Programme (PCP) will be organized for the students of B.Ed.(2-Years) programme at Centre and its approved University, Affiliated Colleges. Besides this each student shall undertake Field Practical's of Three months' duration, one and half month in each year for practice teaching and related work experience activities.
- (c) This programme is for the benefit of the students and they are advised to participate in it regularly. However, 75% attendance for B.Ed. and 50% for other programmes shall be compulsory to become eligible to appear in the examination.
- (d) In exceptional cases, the Director may exempt any candidate from this condition of attending the PCP on valid reason to his satisfaction for which supporting documents like Medical Certificate, etc. may also be enclosed with the application for seeking exemption. In case PCP of any programme is not held before the commencement of the University examination the same will not be the basis for withholding the candidates from appearing in the University Examination.
- (e) In case a candidate has not attended the Personal Contact Programme (Theory and Practical) and has also not been allowed exemption from attending the same, but he/she has already cleared all the dues of the Centre and submitted all the required documents including the Migration Certificate or declaration as per annexure before the commencement of the annual examination to be held in 2024-25 and is otherwise eligible, may appear in the annual examination next year, after fulfilling the requirements of



attending the Personal Contact Programme along with the students of next year i.e. 2025-2026, if PCP (Theory and Practical) are held for the students of the said session, on payment of an additional fee @ Rs.1000/- each for PCP Theory/Practical separately, by submitting the examination form and examination fees afresh to the Controller of Examinations. Such a student will have to apply for attending the PCP etc., to the Director(CDOE) on plain paper with requisite fee of Rs. 1000/- each indicating full particulars of his/her studentship in the Center during the previous session.

3. TENTATIVE SCHEDULE AND LIST OF COLLEGES FOR PERSONAL CONTACT PROGRAMMES(PCP)

The detailed schedule of PCP for each and every class will be available at CDOE Website <u>www.ddekuk.ac.in.</u> Students are advised to download their relevant schedule and report at their allotted college.

(a) Undergraduate Programmes: The Centre organizes Personal Contact Programmes on-line/Off- line for undergraduate programmes preferably during the duration of the Programme in the affiliated Colleges. The tentative list of the Colleges where these programmes are organized is given hereunder:-

- (b) **Postgraduate Programmes**: Personal Contact Programmes are organized in the Kurukshetra University Teaching Departments.
- (c) For Diploma/Bachelor/Master of Library & Inf. Science: The instruction shall be imparted through study material, and/or Personal Contact Programmes. There will be two intensive Personal Contact Programmes, one is separately for the theory papers and the other for practical in Classification/ Cataloguing in the second term. PCP for Theory and Practical paper(s) may be held before the examination of theory papers. However, in exceptional circumstances P.C.P. for practical paper(s) may be held after the examination of Theory Paper(s).
- (d) For CCA, BCA, PGDCA, M.Sc. Computer Sc.(SW), M.C.A and M.Sc. Geography: Two intensive Personal Contact . Programmes (Theory and Practical) separately for CCA, BCA, PGDCA, M.Sc Computer Science(Software), MCA and M.Sc. Geography will be conducted. PCP for Theory and Practical paper(s) may be held before the examination of theory papers. However, in exceptional circumstances PCP for practical paper(s) may be held after the examination of Theory Paper(s).
- (e) For B.Ed. (2-Years) Programme: The Centre has identified the following five Kurukshetra University Affiliated B.Ed. Colleges (duly approved by NCTE) for delivery of programme:
 - (i) Centre for Distance and Online Education, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.
 - (ii) Institute of Teacher Training and Research, K.U. Kurukshetra.
 - (iii) SL DAV College of Education, Ambala City.
 - (iv) SNS College of Education for Women, Yamuna Nagar.
 - (v) Dr. Ganesh Dass DAV College of Education for Women, Karnal.



SECTION - XI

CHANGE OF COURSE/PROGRAMME

The students are advised to select their programmes/session/subjects/options of papers where available very carefully. A student maybe allowed to change the option/subject/programme only once before the generation of hall tickets/roll nos., if otherwise eligible on submission of an application alongwith the fee as mentioned below:-

Note:-

- 1 The option to change will be allowed only once before the generation of hall tickets/roll nos for examination.
- 2. While applying for change of programme/session/subject/option, the students who have already received study material in the previous programme/session/subject/ option must return the same along with application for the change.
- 3. Difference of fee shall be adjusted if a student changes his/her programme with higher rate of fees to a programme with lower rate of fees if the Programme duration is of more than two years.
- 4. The fee on account of change of programme/class will be adjusted against the difference of fees already paid by the students for the subject with higher rate of fee.
- 5. If the progamme is changed with the higher rate of fees, the student will be required to pay difference of fee plus fee for the change of prgramme.



SECTION- XII FACILITIES AVAILABLE

(A) STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

A special feature of the Centre is to ensure removal of difficulties at personal level. Students finding any difficulty in pursuing the distance education programmes with this Centre may get in touch with Director/Concerned Officer/Official or the **Coordinator, Students Support Services in the Centre of Distance Education K.U.K. during working hours.**

The students may also discuss and get their problems solved in consultation with the teachers of the Centre and/or the Programme Co-ordinators during working hours on any working day in the Centre/concerned University Teaching Department.

(B) LIBRARY-CUM-STUDY HALL

The Center has a **centrally air conditioned** Library-cum-Study Hall in its premises at Kurukshetra University having a rich collection of books. Students are advised to visit the Library of the Centre to take advantage of the facilities available to consult books during office hours, on production of the Identity Card issued by the Centre, whenever they happen to visit the CDOE Library.

(C) TEACHING BLOCK

A three storey teaching block exclusively for the distance education students has wellequipped, Library, lecture theatres, common rooms, teachers' rooms, audio-visual aid room, canteen, etc.

(D) UNIVERSITY EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE BUREAU

In collaboration with the Department of Employment of the Haryana Govt., the University is running a full-fledged Employment Information and Guidance Bureau to assist the students in making choice of career and programmes. Students can take full advantage of the facilities available at the Bureau.



ANNEXURE-I

Instructions regarding Bonafide Residents of Haryana issued vide letter No.62/17/95-6 GSI dated 3rd October,1996, No.62/32/2000-6GSI dated 23rd May, 2003, No.62/27/2003-6GSI dated 29th July, 2003 and No.62/62/2011-6GSI dated 17th January, 2012 by the Chief Secretary to Government, Haryana.

SUBJECT: BONAFIDE RESIDENTS OF HARYANA - GUIDELINES REGARDING

- 1. I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters noted in the margin on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification of procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institution (including technical/ medical institution). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgment delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pradeep Jain vs. Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of the word 'Domicile' the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth, the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:-
 - (i) Candidates, who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/ college in Haryana.
 - (ii) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/Dependents:-
 - (a) of the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or working on deputation.
 - (b) of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/corporations established by or under an act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana.
 - (c) of the regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government.
 - (d) Children/wards (if parents not living)/dependents of persons who after retirement have permanently settled in Haryana . and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the State of Haryana.
 - (e) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of pensioners of Haryana Government irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
 - (f) Children/Wards (if parents are not living)/dependents of persons, who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
 - (g) The wives of such persons who are bona fide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
 - (h) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; provided that the parents/ guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging to any one of the above mentioned categories are :
 - (i) Citizen of India;
 - Produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/ dependents have not obtained the benefit of Resident in any other State.
 - (iii) Children & Wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana.



- 2 All candidates claiming to be bona fide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) of the District/Sub-divisions/Tehsildars of Revenue to which the candidates belong. Resident Certificates in respect of elsewhere .or in respect of the Children/Wards/ Dependents of Haryana Govt. employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or .elsewhere or in respect of Children/Wards/Dependents of pensioners of Haryana Govt. or in respect of the .Children/Wards/Dependent of the employees of the Government of India posted at Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of Haryana Government, or in respect of Children/.Wards/Dependents of the Statutory Bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana or a .Central Act and located at Chandigarh, Haryana or outside Haryana, should be by their respective Heads of Departments.
- 3. Candidates seeking admission in educational institutions (including medical and technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school/college situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Headmaster from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Headmaster of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate, which should be sufficient.
- 4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana but at any subsequent time is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, all fees and other dues paid up to the date of such removal shall be confiscated. The Principal/Headmaster may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
- 5. The children/wards/dependents of the employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court, who are discharging their duties in connection with the affairs of the State of Haryana and have not availed facility from their parent State, the State of Punjab and U.T. Administration Chandigarh, would also be eligible for grant of Resident Certificate of the State of Haryana only for the purpose of admission in academic/ technical/medical institutions of the State of Haryana. However, in that case the employees of the Punjab & Haryana High Court shall be entitled to draw this benefit at one place/State only. Head of the Department of the Punjab & Haryana High Court would be competent to issue such a certificate.

As far as block allocation in Block A and Block B of Backward Classes category is concerned, year wise rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block A of Backward Classes are given seats in the Academic Year 2023, the next Block i.e., B Block of category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2024 and so on. The concerned Chairperson/Director of the Department/Institute shall maintain a roster register for horizontal reservation of Ex- servicemen/Freedom Fighter & their dependents and carry forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the year. As and when the total comes to one, a seat will be provided to the concerned category.			



- **Note:-** (a) The reservation of seats as per reservation policy of Haryana Government and is subject to any change/amendment by the State Government from time to time. Where a seat set aside for candidate from Deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government Educational Institutions is not filled up in academic year due to non-availability of candidate of Deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall be made available to candidate of Scheduled Castes. Reserved seats will not be carried forward to next year.
 - (b) Remaining instructions for reservation shall remain the same as already notified by the State Government from time to time.

3.2 GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION:

- (i) If the reserved seat(s) of BC Block 'A' remain vacant these will be filled up from BC Block 'B' and vice versa.
- (ii) The seats remaining vacant under various reserved categories other than SC category will be converted into General Category only if up to the date of display of final list or day of final counselling (whichever applicable), no eligible candidate belonging to the respective reserved categories is available for admission. These vacant seats will be filled up by Haryana General Category (HGC), in case no candidate of HGC is available it will be offered to the candidates of All India Category.
- (iii) The Haryana Govt. vide Notification No.22/132/2013-1GS-III dated 22.03.2022 has intimated that as per Govt. Instruction No.22/132/2013-1GS-III dated 21.03.2014 regarding issuance of caste certificate wherein various competent authorities to verify and issue caste certificate were notified along with other terms & conditions and formats of the caste certificates.

The Haryana Parivar Pehchan Act, 2021, provides for the assignment of the Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a unique identifier number to each family. The database, namely Family Information Data Repository (FIDR), contains PPN alongwith corresponding information generally required for determining eligibility for, or the provision of any scheme, service, subsidy or benefit provided/implemented by or on behalf of the State Govt./any Govt. Agency/Local Authority. State Govt. has been empowered under Section 8 of Act to prescribe Parivar Pehchan Number (PPN) as a requirement for the purpose of determining above mentioned eligibility or provision. The verified information linked with PPN available in Family Information Data Respository (FIDR) has now made it feasible to issue Caste Certificates over the Counter through SARAL Portal. In view of the above, Govt has issued revised instructions/guidelines in supersession of all the previous instructions issued till now, as under:.

- (a) Portal for the issue of Caste Certificate : The Caste Certificate (including Certificates for Scheduled Caste, Deprived Scheduled Caste, Bakward Class, Other Backward Class, Tapriwas, Vimukt Jati (Denotified Tribes), and Nomadic Tribe) shall now be issued to eligible residents of Haryna based on PPN through the SARAL portal (<u>https://saralharyana.gov.in</u>) facsimile signed by ADC-cum-DCRIO (Additional Deputy Commissioner-cum-District Citizen Resources Information Officer) or Head of the Department/Organization, as the case may be.
- (b) Validity of a Caste Certificate:
 - 1. A Caste Certificate once issued (in its standard format) shall be valid for the life time of the person so long as such caste/tribe is not removed or modified in the notifications issued by the Welfare of SC and BC Dept., Haryana.
 - 2. Where a Caste Certificate is requested for specific use outside the context of Govt. of Haryana, it shall be issued in the format prescribed by the Govt. of India.



- 3. Certificates which include income and/or assets based information like creamy layer criteria shall become invalid after the validity period prescribed on the said certificate. Such certificates shall be valid for the current financial year i.e. till coming 31st March (included) from the date it has been issued.
- 4. A Caste Certificate may also become invalid if after due process, it has been concluded that the caste was incorrectly mentioned on the certificate or wrongly verified in the FIDR, due to any reason whatsoever.

As per Govt. Notification No.2/27/2019-1 GS-III dated 8.10.2020and No.22/132/2013-1GS-III dated 22.03.2022,the candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Caste will submit the certificate as per **Annexure-II (1)** (Scheduled Caste Certificate) and **Annexure-II (2)** (Deprived Scheduled Caste Certificate). Backward Class (Block 'A' & 'B') will submit the certificate on the prescribed Proforma as per **Annexure-III** and Income Certificate from the Competent Authority. Vide Notification No. 512-SW(1)2021 dated 01.12.2021 and 491-SW(1) dated 17.11.2021the Government of Haryana Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department has specified the criteria for persons within Backward Class as Creamy Layer regarding Reservation in Services and Admissions in Educational Institution. Son(s) and daughter (s) of parents having gross annual income of Rs.6 Lakhs or above OR possessing wealth above Rs.1 Crore for period of last three consecutive years. Income from all sources shall be clubbed to arrive at the gross annual income.

- (i) Affidavit/Undertaking by the BC and EWS Candidates: BC (Block A&B) and EWS candidates for benefit of reservation shall also have to furnish the certificates as per proforma given in the Hand Book of Information. In case, a candidates upload the old BC/Income Certificate or EWS Income & Asset Certificate, he/she shall furnish an affidavit on the prescribed proforma to the effect that he/she is not covered under the criteria of creamy layer (for BC Category) (Annexure-XVI) or belongs to Economically Weaker Sections (Annexure XVII), which is not recognized as a Schedule Caste and Backward Classes (Block-A & B) by the Government of Haryana, as per Annexure-III&IV, respectively at the time of display of first/second/third/final list and so on. The said affidavit shall be furnished jointly by both father and mother of the candidate. The student shall submit BC/Income Certificate or EWS Income & Asset Certificate within 15 days from the date of display of his/her name in admission list, failing which his/her admission is liable to be cancelled. The income certificate mentioning gross annual income issued on/after 1.4.2024 for claiming reservation/supernumerary seat/tuition fee waiver in any category (where admission criteria is income based) shall only be considered for availing benefit under any reserved category/supernumerary seat/tuition fee waiver category.
- (ii) Only the candidates having permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the programme) will be considered for admission as Differently Abled. Disability certificate must be issued by the Chief Medical Officer of the concerned District. However, the certificate shall be subject to verification by a Medical Board of the University constituted for the purpose and the decision of the Board shall be final. Differently Abled candidates belonging to Haryana are required to submit the certificate as per Annexure-VI (Medical certificate for Differently abled) given in the HBI.



- (iii) A Medical Board of the following doctors for the session 2024-25 has been constituted for verification of differently abled certificates of differently abled candidates for admission to various programmes in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes:
 - (a) Dr. Ashish Aneja, M.O (Chairman) (b) Dr. Minu Gupta, M.O (Member)
- (iv) Children and Grand-Children of Freedom Fighters of Haryana are required to submit a certificate from the concerned Deputy Commissioner of the concerned District as per **Annexure-VII**.
- (v) Certificate from Ex-Servicemen and their wards for Deceased or Disabled or Discharged Military/ Paramilitary Personnel, Ex-Servicemen or Ex-Personnel of Para-Military Forces as per Annexure-VIII.
- (vi) Certificate from Ex-Employees and their wards for the Ex-employees of Indian Defence Services/Paramilitary Forces as per **Annexure-IX**.
- (vii) For horizontal reservation, ESM/DFF candidates of General, SC and BC category will also have to furnish ESM/DFF certificate.
- (viii) In pursuance of the decision of Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh dated 11.04.2013 in the LPA 98/2013 (O&M) CWP No.20359 of 2012, Sh. Ishwar Singh Vs KUK &Others, preference shall be given to ESM first before giving admission to wards against ESM reserved seats
- (ix) As per instructions of the Government of Haryana, General Administration Department, General Services-III Branch, Chandigarh containing in letter No. 22/10/2013-1GSIII dated 10.08.2017 for giving following priorities for reservations or preferences to the wards of Armed
- (x) Forces personnel for admission in medical/professional/non-professional programmes running in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes/Affiliated/Maintained Colleges/Institutes:-

(a)	Priority-I	Widows/Wards of Defence personnel killed in action.		
(b)	Priority-II	Wards of disabled in action and boarded out from service.		
(c)	Priority-III	Widows/Wards of Defence personnel who died while in service with death attributable to military service.		
(d)	Priority-IV	Wards of disabled in service and boarded out with disability attributable to military service.		
(e)	Priority-V	Wards of Ex-servicemen who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards: (i) Param Vir Chakra, (ii) Ashok Chakra, (iii) Sarvottam Yudh Seva Medal, (iv)Maha Vir Chakra, (v) Kirti Chakra, (vi) Uttam Yudh Seva Medal, (vii) Vir Chakra, (viii) Shaurya Chakra, (ix)Yudh Seva Medal,(x) Sena, Nau Sena, Vayu Sena Medal, (xi) Mention-in- Despatches		
(f)	Priority-VI	Wards of Ex-servicemen.		

The Admission Committee vide its Res. No. 6 dated 14.05.2018 has resolved the above instructions of the State Govt. be implemented in all the programmes being run in the University Teaching Departments/ Institutes and affiliated/ maintained Colleges.



- (xi) Under Persons with Disabled category, at least one seat wll be offered, even if the share is less than 0.5 seat.
- (xii) If a candidate of Haryana General, SC, BC and EWSs also apply for Persons with Disability/ ESM/ DFF category will be considered first for Haryana General, SC, BC and EWSs category.
- (xiii) *All the eligible candidates, whether from Haryana or from reserved categories can also compete for seats allocated under All India Category.
- (xiv) *All the eligible candidates of reserved categories of Haryana shall be considered first for Haryana General category seats.
 *(Note:- Allotment of seats under Clause (xvi) & (xvii)above shall be strictly as per Director General Higher Education, Haryana Letter No.12/1-2017AD(3) Dated 04.06.2018 and Principal Secretary to Govt. Haryana Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes, Department, Chandigarh letter

No.EC/2018/20179-389 dated 26.04.2018.

- (xv) Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from a university in the State of Haryana will be deemed to be Haryana residents and will not be required to submit certificates of bonafide residents of Haryana.
- (xvi) 30% seats in M.P.Ed., B.P.Ed. and P.G.Diploma in Yoga will be reserved for female candidates in all categories.
- (xvii) Differently Abled candidates will not be considered for admission to M.P.Ed., B.P.Ed. and P.G. Diploma in Yoga.
- (xviii) **Criteria for EWS in Haryana Category seats:** Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 as under:
 - a. Income & Assets Certificate Issuing Authority:
 - (i) The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Competent Authority for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be Tehsildar of the area where the applicant normally resides.
 - (ii) As per instructions given in Govt. of Haryana General Administration Dept. (G-III Branch) Notification No.22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 13.03.2019, Verifying Authorities for issue of EWS Certificate shall be same as prescribed for issue of resident/income certificates as specified in instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004.
 - (iii) The prescribed format for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be provided at Annexure-IV.

b. Criteria of Income & Assets:

- (i) Persons, who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled
- (ii) Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs.6.00 lakh (Rupees six lakh only), are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.



- (iii) Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:
 - a) 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
 - b) Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - c) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
 - d) Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities;
 - e) Total immovable assets owned are valued at Rs.One Crore of more.
 - (v) The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
 - (vi) The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who applies for benefit of reservation, his/her parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18 years.
- **Note**:- For any other clarification, Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 will be referred.

(xix) Criteria for EWS in All India Category Seats:

The reservation @ 10% to Economically Weaker Sections in All India Category seats (i.e. 15% of sanctioned intake) under Centre Govt. policy would be in addition to the existing reservation. Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions Department of Personnel & Training, Government of India Notification No.36039/1/2019-Estt (Res) dated 31.01.2019 and the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula vide their letter No.40395 DHE-190005/97/2020-UNP (STATE)-DHE dated 19.04.2021as under:

(a) Criteria of Income & Assets:

(i) Persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs and whose family has gross annual income below Rs. 8.00 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.

Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-

- (a) 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
- (b) (b) Residential fiat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- (c) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- (d) Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- (ii) The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed. while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- (iii) The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.



(b) Income & Assets Certificate Issuing Authority:

- (i) The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following authorities in the prescribed format as given in Annexure-V shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as belonging to EWS:-
 - (a) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/1st Class Stipendary Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate /Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner
 - (b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
 - (c) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and Sub-Divisional Officer or the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.
